## CULTIVATING STUDENT SUCCESS AT UCR: PEDAGOGICAL IDEAS, DATA, AND RESOURCES TO CONSIDER

## **PEDAGOGICAL IDEAS**

Research in education teaches us that validating students during the first few weeks of the quarter/school year, is vital to the student experience (Rendon, 1994). The practice of validation, Rendon argues, can be delivered by higher education staff and faculty, particularly in institutions like UCR which is designated as an MSI, HSI, and AANAPISI.

What kinds of messages do you deliver to students during the first couple weeks of class? I have made it a practice in my own work to deliver the following to students:

"you belong here" "your family needs you here" "your community needs you here" "we need you here"

Consider this practice. It could go a long way with students and can help create a climate of validation in your classroom.
