
How do you approach your first day of class? Do you typically introduce yourself to your students? How?

- Select a challenge and what you did to overcome that challenge and/or a triumph and the factors that shaped your success.
- Consider adding music and make it fun!

The Transfer Success Program in the **Academic Resource Center provides support** for transfer students to excel in their academic, professional, and personal pursuits. The program offers mentorship, workshops, and events.

Some transfer students may experience transfer shock during the first quarter at UCR while they adjust to the new expectations of a large research university. Transfer shock can negatively influence students' GPA and adjustment without adequate support and resources (Hills, 1965; Taylor et al., 2017).
