

Impact23 Program & Timeline

The Impact23 program is a multi-year initiative to **replace our financial system** and transform how UC Riverside (UCR) transacts, develops budgets, tracks spending/revenue, and performs financial reporting.

The program is a collaborative project involving BFS, ITS, FP&A, Research (RED), our implementation partners, and campus stakeholders to implement a comprehensive suite of cloud-based solutions: **Oracle, Concur, and Kuali.**

REASONS FOR CHANGE

- UC Office of the President has mandated adoption of a common chart of accounts by July 2023
- UCR formally evaluated options via an RFI in 2018, and all RFI responses recommended Oracle Cloud vs. other options, which included upgrading existing systems
- Campus last upgraded its financial systems in 2005, from a 1999 implementation, and UCR's current PeopleSoft version (8.8) is no longer supported as of May 2019
- Many of the business applications (e.g., eBuy, iTravel) are end of life and not feasible to update without impacting financial systems
- UCR campus departments need more robust reporting, and data analytics to best perform fiscal responsibilities

- Future-proof solution to allow for feature and security upgrades, with continued vendor support
- Implement leading practices and business process transformations
- Deliver meaningful benefits to campus users
- Learn from the UCPath implementation

What are the Impacted Systems?

Boundary Systems

A **Boundary System** is a UCR ITS custom-developed application, or configured third-party system, that interacts with the campus financial system and/or financial data (meaning, the boundary system pulls data from or pushes data to the Oracle financial system).

 Examples: Work Order Systems (Fleet Service for UCR Vehicle Rental), Financial Reporting, UCPath, etc.

WHAT'S CHANGING FOR FACULTY?

What's changing for Faculty?

The Impact23 Program is a multi-year initiative to transform how UC Riverside (UCR) transacts, develops budgets, tracks spending/revenue, and performs financial reporting. Nearly all financial systems that support finance and grant management and financial reporting will be impacted on **July 1, 2023**.

Some key changes:

- All employees, including faculty, will use Oracle, Kuali, or Concur (Impact23 systems) in some capacity.
- Faculty and their departments will manage travel, purchasing requests, grants and awards, and approvals in new Impact23 systems.
- Vocabulary used to refer to different business processes and systems will change.
- Transactions and Faculty Financial Reports will transition from the Full Accounting Unit (FAU) to the new Chart of Accounts (COA) upon go-live.
- Faculty and their departments are encouraged to increase utilization of the corporate-liability Travel and Entertainment (T&E Card) and the Procurement Card (PCard) for unrestricted goods and services under \$10K.



What can Faculty expect?

- Administrative staff will be most impacted by the switch to the new chart of accounts and financial systems.
- In March 2023, the University will begin training and preparing faculty and staff for the transition to new systems on July 1, 2023. Faculty-specific training will be provided on when and how to perform actions in new systems.
- During this time, collaboration, patience, and understanding are key to our success as we all move toward modern, cloud-based technology.
- Resources are available to help as we make this important shift toward the future.
- Faculty will be kept informed along the way and can expect to receive updates and training as we get closer to launching the new systems.
